

World Ag Expo 2010 — “Powering Global Agriculture”

(Tulare, Calif., AgPR, July 31, 2009) — New and noteworthy for World Ag Expo 2010 is the expanded agriculture seminars center. The expanded seminars center sits on a 1,200-square-foot section of the dairy expansion area in the South section of the show grounds and will hold all the seminars for the three-day expo.

“The seminars at World Ag Expo have always been popular with our attendees, and it has been tough to narrow down the selection to only 40 each year,” said Bernie Cargle, 2010 World Ag Expo chairman. “With the expansion of the seminars center, we have the opportunity to add an additional 15 seminars to the already great lineup.”

In 2010, the expansion area will contain all of the 2009 seminar categories plus seminars for the beef industry, hay and forage and an additional area of interest to be announced.
